

Singapore Raptor Report Autumn Migration, October 2010

Summary for migrant species:

A total of 139 migrant raptors from 8 species were recorded this month. **Oriental Honey Buzzards** took the top spot with 108 birds. Peter Jones counted 62 of these birds in a 45 minutes period from 11:45am to 12:30pm at Tuas on 24 October. **Japanese Sparrowhawks** came in second in terms of numbers with a total of 12. The third placing was a surprise as it went to the uncommon **Chinese Sparrowhawk**. Present in small numbers were the **Ospreys**. Sun Chong Hong had been expecting the **Peregrine Falcon** that he had seen in Spring 2009, Autumn 2009 and Spring 2010 in Bishan. The falcon arrived on the 11th and perched, as usual, on top of a high rise building. For 3 species, there was only a single sighting. A juvenile **Eastern Marsh Harrier** was seen at Changi on the 9th by Tan Kok Hui, Danny Lau and Con Foley. The **Common Buzzard** made it into this month with a single bird at the usual hangout – Changi – on the 30th, by Danny Lau and Lau Jia Sheng. On the last day of the month, Alfred Chia recorded 2 **Black Bazas** at Seletar West.

Highlights for sedentary species:

The Bird Race on Pulau Ubin on the 24th produced two interesting records for resident raptors. A rare **Crested Serpent Eagle** was seen by Alan Owyong and his team, flying across Ubin's main village just after noon. The other notable record was that of 2 **Grey-headed Fish Eagles** – a juvenile and a sub-adult. This appears to be the first record of this species for Pulau Ubin. An even greater rarity – the **Crested Goshawk** – re-appeared at the Singapore Zoo. The last sighting of this species at the same location was that of a juvenile. This time it was an adult.

After I got back to the ground level, I saw the PF leaving the perch. A short while later, it disappeared behind a building. Just then I heard the sharp shrill call of a Javan Myna. I am now familiar with this call. It signals that the PF is pursuing its prey. I look up immediately and saw two birds diving. Before I could identify the birds within the split second, the view was again blocked by buildings and trees. The branch snapped. It all happened very fast. The piece she got hold of was massive not much short of 4 foot plus. It must have been close to the limit what the eagle could carry as the bird never gained any height before half crashing into another tree on the other side of the quarry. I call the bird she even if I haven’t a clue what sex this adult bird has. The eagle during the rest of the time I stayed just moved from one perch to another.”</i>	Ulf Remahl
